





# My Experience at the 2022 Adequan®/USDF Annual Convention

In 2022 NODA was seeking someone to attend the 2022 United States Dressage Federation Annual Convention in Lexington Kentucky as the voting delegate. Many on the board had been more than once, but I had never had the

opportunity, so when it was mentioned at a board meeting, I jumped at the chance and I'm so glad I did. I really didn't know what to expect, but it was very educational and eyeopening. NODA provided monetary support for my attendance, but anyone can attend and I would recommend going at least once. I was honored to represent NODA.

As a member of two USDF **Group Member Organizations** 

in northeast Ohio, NODA and CADS, I wondered if CADS had anyone attending, but they had no one going this year. They asked if I would be their proxy vote and of course, I said yes. But being a voting delegate and a proxy sounded a little daunting to me, when in reality, it was a great experience. Attendance at the Board of Governors (BOG) General Assembly and becoming educated on the votes that will be put forward are mandatory. A voting delegate from a GMO may be called on throughout the following year when the USDF needs a quorum for the Board of Governors unless the GMO changes the voting delegate after the convention whereas a proxy carries the vote for a GMO only for the designated voting dates at the specific meeting of the Board of Governors they are attending. Once a person is designated a delegate and/or a proxy, the USDF provides access to information that will be voted on at the convention. Each GMO is assigned a specific number of votes based on membership (renew today!), so a GMO wants to exercise those votes. Once at the convention, a delegate checks in, is assigned specific computer codes for each GMO to check in with at each meeting of the BOG. Checking in lets leadership know who is in attendance and that there is a quorum. Most votes are yay or nay by voice, but some votes go to the computer and require a delegate/proxy to input their codes and vote. So the BOG is the business aspect of the convention, but I found the USDF has a good sense of humor and has developed a culture which makes the BOG a

in." Roll call started promptly at a specified time and there was a friendly competition to see which regions and GMO's would have all the reps signed in prior to the roll call. Participants wanted to avoid the good natured ribbing and the 'walk of shame to the computer banks" if able.



committees, a budget proposal, presentations by candidates for open offices, Q&A, and reports from USEF and The Dressage Foundation. Saturday, the voting meeting started with a welcome coffee break with delicious bakery. Also on Saturday, the GMO Awards were presented, and I was thrilled to accept for NODA and have my photo taken with USDF president George Williams for our winners and so happy to hear our honorable mentions announced. NODA was well represented!

And finally, the BOG features fun gift baskets donated by GMO's from around the United States which go to participants in a drawing during the BOG meetings. Every dele-

gate drops their name in the designated box and during the BOG when things get slow and people fidget- it's basket drawing time! I didn't win one, but it was great fun seeing what was in each basket and anticipate the possibility of winning one. Time wise, the BOG was a small part of the convention experience, and very educational.

The rest of the convention was made up of open forums, educational events, and socials. Open Forums included committee meetings and reviews such as the Technical Council, Competition Management, Instructor Trainer Development, Regional Championship, Activities Council, Sport Horse, and a Regional meetings to name a few. There were also educational events such as a "New Test Overview" with a judge and trainer presenting, "Equine Podiatry" by Dr. Craig Lesser and "First Aid; a Response to Equestrian Emergencies" with Gwen Ka'awaloa, critical care tech for an emergency department, EMT I, horse trainer and expert in horse trauma. There was a great presentation on "Constructing a Wellness Program for the Aging Performance Horse" with Dr. Avi Blake. Every single session was educational, I took copious notes and learned something at each one. And in between they fed us and provided social events.

Upon check-in check in on Wednesday we were surprised with the information that the USDF would provide daily boxed lunches. This meant we would all be eating in a common area so this was a great opportunity to chat with people between sessions. The convention center was huge- I walked 5 miles a day indoors. So between the hotel and convention center and taking "break walks" between sessions, I was hungry and the lunchtime chats were welcome.

There were also display tables where we could talk with reps of participating organizations which included Adequan, the title sponsor of the convention, USDF with a USDF store where we got a reduced rate on items purchased, and The Dressage Foundation which supports riders. Region 2 also had an unstaffed table. Those of us in Region 2 that have a print or online newsletter were encouraged to bring copies and of course I took a stack of 2022 NODA News editions. Many of the NODA News copies were taken as samples and I had to refresh the supply more than once a day. NODA received many positive comments on the newsletter, which as editor was exciting. I took samples of other GMO newsletters for ideas.

The welcome reception on Thursday evening was fun with an open bar, heavy hors d'oeuvres and greeting friends old and new. There were two

nomination which was guite impressive and then Lisa shared a few words touching on her overall dressage journey with her usual dry humor included.





# Applying for a Grant or Scholarship By Mosie Welch

Many NODA members have applied for grants and scholarships and been successful, but like going to a show or a clinic it takes preplanning. I applied for a Gifted Memorial Fund for Adult Amateurs grant from The Dressage Foundation (TDF) in 2022 for 2023 and was honored and excited to have been selected and also

thrilled to be awarded a NODA Amateur Scholarship for 2023. Sadly, three 2023 NODA Amateur Scholarships went unclaimed and not many professionals put in for the grant available to them. It would be great if other NODA members took advantage of the funding available to expand dressage knowledge and skills.

So, what do you need to know to apply for a grant? Whether it's a NODA Scholarship for amateurs, a NODA Professional Grant, or a grant from The Dressage Foundation, it's not hard, it just requires some preplanning.

There are funds available for riders at all levels, both professionals and amateurs, and in both classical and Western dressage. Breeders, trainers, USEF officials, young riders, and adults are all included. Grant and Scholarship funds are a huge benefit of belonging to the USDF or GMO. Get familiar with what is available NOW.

Make a plan and start the process early. You need time to review the grant requirements and application forms to see what you need to pull together. For the Gifted Memorial Fund an applicant needs to put together a training plan with the trainer you will work with, explain how you plan to spend quality time with your horse, and you will need a reference as well as a letter from the trainer you are working with. For the NODA Amateur Scholarship you need to log your volunteer hours, get references with signatures, and answer questions about your goals, although you do NOT have to know exactly what you'll do with the funds. Don't forget to note the grant deadlines.

Be sure you compete the paperwork as instructed. TDF makes it easy as they provide a word template that applicants can use to pull together information and use that to copy and paste into the online application. NODA grant and scholarship applications can be printed off, completed, and then mailed or scanned and sent by email.

There are benefits to applying beyond the funding you may receive. Applying for grants provided a great opportunity to focus on goals with my trainer, Emily Gill. It helps when you discuss the various to meet those goals while keeping you and your horse mentally and physically happy. Ground work, cross training, lunge lessons, shadowing and focused dressage work may be considered depending on what you are applying for. I have not used my grant funds yet, but the time developing the applications helped me focus on specific goals.

So if you've ever considered applying for a grant or scholarship, winter is a great time to get started by checking out what's available and start pulling your application together.

Do NOT leave funds on the table. Good luck!

Lexington, KY (January 12, 2023) - The United States Dressage Federation™ (USDF) 2023 Executive Board is now in place to guide the federation throughout the next year, while planning for its future. At the 2022 Adequan®/USDF Annual Convention, elections were held for the positions of Vice President, Secretary, and Region 1, 3, 5, 7, and 9 Directors with Kevin Reinig (CA), Debra Reinhardt (CT), Bettina Longaker (VA), Charlotte Trentelman (FL), Heather Petersen (CO), Carolyn Tice (CA), and Bess Bruton (TX) emerging victorious.

The races for Vice President and Secretary were uncontested, with incumbent Kevin Reinig and former Region 8 Director Debra Reinhardt winning by acclimation. Other uncontested positions included Region 1, 3, 7, and 9, with all but Region 3 featuring an incumbent. In the race for Region 5 Director, Heather Petersen (incumbent) edged out her opponent, securing another term.

The USDF Executive Board is comprised of four officers, nine regional directors, and three at-large directors, all representing various factions of the sport and the membership. USDF President George Williams recognized all outgoing and incoming board members at the annual convention and had this to say, "While we are always sad to see board members go, I am confident that each of the 2023 members bring with them the passion, knowledge, and drive that will serve both the federation and the sport tremendously as we continue forward."

## Dressage Protocol - Get ready for your show season with USDF University Learn the do's and dont's about dressage competitions etiquette

**Introduction** All professional sports have a ruling organization to legislate and administer what is legal and illegal. Many sports also have a protocol that clarifies the etiquette of the sport and the way you go about the business of competing. A protocol explains the difference between what is acceptable and what is not. Thanks to the work of the USDF Technical Delegate Committee, the sport of dressage has its own protocol. Competitors who follow this protocol before, during, and after competitions can take comfort in the fact that, whatever their score, they will have conducted themselves in a way that brings credit to both themselves and their sport.

**Note** These guidelines were inspired by the wisdom and dedication of Colonel Clarence Edmonds, previous chairman of the USDF Council of Technical Delegates. They are patterned after the U.S. Tennis Association's booklet, "The Code." There are rules governing tennis tournaments, but "The Code" puts into writing the unwritten rules of etiquette and good manners expected of tennis players. Dressage competitions are governed by the rules and regulations of USEF. Dressage protocol addresses the etiquette and manners for dressage competitors. A review of these guidelines before your competition year begins and periodically thereafter, even for experienced competitors, will make for more enjoyable competition experiences for all involved.


