NODA SCHOOLING SHOW (SS) & EDUCATION EVENT BIO-SECURITY REQUIREMENTS

As of June 2024

The following is required to be sent to Schooling Show Secretary or Event Organizer PRIOR TO the SS or Event via email

- 1. Negative Coggins Within twelve months
- Vaccinations Record Within six months It is required that all horses be vaccinated for Equine-EHV I/IV (either modified live or killed vaccine) and Equine Influenza no sooner than seven days and no later than 180 days (six months) prior to the event. USEF Equine Vaccination Record Form can be found HERE

The following is required UPON ARRIVAL at the SS or Event. SS or Event Mgmt. will inspect these documents before unloading of horses is permitted

- 3. **Pre-Event Temperature Record** Track and record temperatures for a minimum of two days prior to arrival, Use the USEF form for recording temperatures which can be found HERE
- 4. **Owner/Agent Health Declaration and Disclosure Form** Signed by an owner/agent confirming the overall health of the horse prior to arrival at the event. Form can be found HERE
- 5. If coming from out of the state, a Health Certificate is needed (within 14 days) Required for all horses arriving from outside the state of Ohio and signed by a veterinarian.

The following is required **DURING** the SS or Event

- 1. **Twice daily temperature checks:** Morning and evening temps (roughly 12 hours apart) will be required during the horse's stay at the event. Temperatures MUST be taken rectally. Repeated violations of this policy will be subject to further action by Event Management and may include being asked to leave the event grounds.
- 2. **Event Facilities:** No Use of event facility pastures, turnouts or any other event amenity that VISITING horses are NOT allowed to use. Repeat violators will not be allowed to return to the venue.
- 3. **Reporting to SS/Event Mgmt**: Any resting temperature over 101.5 F degrees or abnormal clinical signs must be reported to Event Management immediately. The horse will immediately be moved to a stall away from all other horses (if possible). A veterinarian will be called to come examine the horse (at the owner's expense) to determine if isolation or testing of the horse for a potential equine infectious disease is necessary. If the veterinarian deems that the horse must be quarantined, it must be removed from the event facility immediately. All event participants will be informed of the situation and kept up to date.

The following is required AFTER the SS or Event is over and participants have returned home

1. If your horse begins to display a fever or clinical signs of a contagious nature within 14 days of departing the event, for tracking purposes, please notify the Schooling Show Manager/Secretary or Event Coordinator immediately.

Bio-Security Best Practices at home and at events

- Take temperatures of all horses twice daily and maintain a log for each horse.
- Limit nose-to-nose contact between horses.
- Handlers and riders should maintain distances between horses at all times.
- Avoid non-essential people touching horses.
- Practice good hygiene. Handlers should wash hands in-between handling horses and maintain proper biosecurity protocols in the barns and rings.
- Avoid sharing equipment unless it is thoroughly cleaned and disinfected.
